Hawaii Banks Support Funding for Effective July 1, 2008, an amendment to Rule 11 of the Rules of the Hawaii Supreme Court was adopted. This amendment requires all banks participating in the Interest on Lawyer Trust Accounts (IOLTA) program to pay the highest interest rate generally available at their institutions to their non-IOLTA accounts when IOLTA accounts meet the same minimum balance or other account qualifications. This action by the Court will significantly increase funding for legal service providers and other access to justice initiatives. Hawaii becomes the twentieth state to adopt this rate comparability requirement.

The Hawaii Justice Foundation (HJF) has worked closely with all nine banks that presently participate in IOLTA program. HJF has developed the Prime Partner Program, where participating banks choose to pay more than may be legally required under Rule 11. HJF is very
