# Our professional roles have been so vastly different

 The impact of belief systems and community values infiltrates the development, improvement and effectiveness of the work we each do, in our respective roles:

Judge and Advocate/Activist

#### **Annual Judicial Statistics**

- According to the 2013 annual Judiciary Statistical Supplement, there were a total of 2,985 TROs filed in FY 2012-2013.
- There are about 75-90 petitions filled out per week (some unfiled).
- Each judge hears about 8 hearings per day. 8 hearings x
  3 judges x 4 days per week = 96 hearings per week
- The most recent hard data is from fiscal year 2010-2011 In FY2010-2011, 2,500 petitions were filed. Of those 2,500, 91%, or 2,200 petitions, were granted

#### **Misconceptions**
