Program Updates

- No asset tests for certain programs:
 - BESSD: DHS introduced legislation in 2013 to eliminate the asset limits for the TANF/TAONF programs
 - MQD: In October, 2013, Affordable Care Act (ACA) expanded Medicaid eligibility by removing asset limits for parents/caretaker relatives and childless adults
- Timeliness:
 - □ SNAP: now 97% up from 66% in 2011
 - Medicaid: now approaching 100%



Data trends

Med-QUEST:

- □ 284,532 persons received Medicaid in 9/13 a 38% increase since 2008 (external event: economic downturn)
- □ 10/1/2013: Launch of KOLEA & implementation of Affordable Health Care Act
- □ 313,344 persons receiving Medicaid as of 4/30/14 a 10% increase since 9/13
- SNAP: In FY 2013, approximately 94,649 Hawaii families received SNAP benefits, an approximate 9.52% increase over the average monthly number of families receiving SNAP benefits in FY 2012 (86,418)
- Child Care: Pre School Open Doors (POD) program currently serves approximately 325 children per year. The DHS anticipates serving up to 1,200 children between July 1, 2014 and June 30, 2015.
