- 3. Premium Assistance Program (PSA) is a special state program that provides income-qualified residents coverage for their out-of-pocket monthly "silver plan" health insurance premiums. You must enroll in your health plan through the Federal Marketplace (Obama Care). Participants in the PSA are responsible for paying their own deductibles and co-payments. The PSA only pays for your silver plan insurance premiums.
